ST. JOSEPH'S CHURCH COMPLETES PLAN OF RENOVATING EDIFICE

A complete transformation has taken place in St. Joseph's Roman Catholic Church, Acton, with the completion of extensive decoration to the interior.

In conjunction with the parishioners, Rev. Father V. J. Morgan, present pastor, has finished a project which started with his appointment to the parish several years ago. The aging edifice, a milestone in Acton's history, presents an entirely renovated appearance—inside and out.

The exterior, completed last year, has new green shingling and copper eavestroughing. A grey foundation was enhanced with a cream on the pillars which lend a distinctive appearance to the former red brick building.

Inside, the floor is relaid with green and red patch work tiling which blends richly with an ivory shade on the walls. A pale blue ceiling casts a soft glow over the interior to the focal point—the main altar.

Contrasting harmoniously with the seating section, the altar is like a gem in their midst. A pattern in dark hues extends from the Gospel to the Epistle side, directly behind the altar which sets off the ivory of the tabernacle in a halo that might denote purity.

The pews have been painted and the gallery is supported by four marble-like Grecian pillars. A host of other sundry items have been decorated which take in the entire interior.

Emblazoned above the grotto-like sanctuary is a quotation from the liturgy of the mass "Benedicite Vos Omnipotens Deus." Translated, it reads "May God Almighty Bless You" which perhaps is significant with the spirit of the pioneers who first came to the present church and established their heritage of faith—their church.
