

When released, the film will be available to film councils and film libraries and is being considered for release to theatres. It will also get nation-wide screening and the NFB's extensive system of rural circuits. Eventually, it will be giinternational distribution through the Board's foreign offices, Canada's embassies, legations and trade commissioners' offices. In this it will probably be produced in a number of foreign languages and may go to as many as 70 countries

other than Canada and the United

States. NFB's film on the weekly newspapers of Canada will not be a mere screen document of the mechanics of publishing a paper. . Of necessity, it will show the operations of publication but the principal aim of the production will be to emphasize how vitally the paper and its editor and staff enter into community life and activities, how they serve the area covered by the paper and how the activities in that area affect the paper and its contents and services.

Rather than leap from one place to another and try to cover all of the hundreds of weekly newpapers in the Dominion - a process that would result in confusion and defeat the purpose of the film -- the production will center around a single publication and use it to tell the story of all weeklies. 
