Entered in thirteen classes, prize ribbons were won in twelve of these including first in the four-in-hand. Joyce, a student at Georgetown High School, who started her riding career when she was a youngster, won first place in a special ladies class in which her mother placed sixth.

A great thrill came afterwards when this class was chosen as one of the features of a technicolor movie which the National Film Board was making of the Fair. For the movie, the class was composed in the ring the next day, and judging was carried out exactly as it had been at the evening performance. Local theatre-goers will be looking forward to seeing the short on the Roxy screen in a month or two if manager Jack Polly can arrange for a booking.

**H. J. Newman is A.A.U.C. Representative This District**

H. J. "Hal" Newman, Georgetown Recreational Director, has been appointed representative in this district for the Central Ontario Branch of the Amateur Athletic Union of Canada. Under Mr. Newman's jurisdiction will be Georgetown district, which embraces all of Halton, Peel and Dufferin Counties and that portion of Wellington County east of the Everton-Corwin line. In future registration of athletes and affiliation of organizations in this district will all be made through Mr. Newman who in turn will turn over applications to the Registration Chairman in Toronto.

One of the chief duties of the A. A. U. branches is to prevent, through its sanction authority, similar sports competitions being held on the same date, particularly within a radius of 100 miles, and a special appeal is being made to organizations contemplating track and field meets next summer to submit their sanction application as early as possible.

**TOWNSHIP SNOW PLOWING CONTRACTS AWARDED**

Meeting at the call of the Reeve on Monday, November 24, all members of Esquasing Council attended a special meeting held in Norval to open tenders for snow plowing. Tenders were received from Hamilton Brothers, Harry Beer, Fred Ruddell and David Wendover and Sons.

It was moved by Crs. Reid and Leslie that the tenders of Hamilton Brothers and of Harry Beer be accepted, the contracts running from December 16th, 1947, to March 15, 1948. The work will be under the direction of Road Superintendent W. E. Townsend, subject to the approval of the Department of Highways.

It was moved by Bird and Currie that Council purchase from R. H. Thompson and Co. a Pease 25-cycle Commercial Oil Burner, 3 gallons per hour nozzle with a 1000 gallon tank installed, less electric wiring at a price of \$689.50.

The Council adjourned to meet again at 10 o'clock on December 15th.
