Recreational This and That

OLD TOWN HALL: After years of up and mostly down the auditorium at the old Town Hall is gradually shaping up into a modern community hall. Outwardly the changes have been hardly noticeable but when the G.R.C. finally open the doors for public inspection, it is felt sure that the citizens of Georgetown will be proud of the old place. These are but a few of the changes:

A new floor has been set in the entrance hall.

All door and windows have been re-caulked, set and glazed.

Two new rooms have been installed at the head of the stairway. These will be washrooms and toilets for boys and girls. The plaster work on these hasn't been completed yet, but all the rough work has been finished.

Most important, the Lions Club have already installed the preliminary pipe work for both toilets and wash basins and believe it or not, folks, pipes for a hot water heater. This toilet business is really a major operation and the Lions Club expect that it will cost more than \$400.00 before the job is complete. I think everyone in Georgetown will agree that this is a splendid effort by the Lions, and all the members of that service club are to be highly commended.

In order to make room for the washrooms, the old entrance doors into the auditorium had to be moved near the head of the stairway and this change will afford more seating capacity in the hall.

The old lower room has been remodelled and this when completed will make an excellent office for the Recreational Director and also a place to keep suitable records and general information on recreation, etc.

Spacious storage cupboards for sports equipment have been constructed in the balcony and the balance of this area will eventually be a large store room for all recreational equipment.

In addition to all this the whole top floor has been rewired with proper outlets so that the old danger of poor wiring has been eliminated. When Apprentice Productions put on their play next month the audience will be able to see the effects of more stage lighting.

But all the above changes would be useless unless the place could be heated. Well, heat we have. The installation of the heating plant is all but complete and folks, the temperature in the Old Hall is well over 60 degrees all the time. That 60 degrees tells the real story of a long battle with the cold which defeated most of our efforts last winter. So now, with the New Year nearly upon us, we hope that programmes which have been planned for over a year will actually be able to get underway.
