TROPHIES PRESENTED AT SUNDAY BAND CONCERT

Two cups won at the Waterloo Festival were presented to the Lorne Scots Band by Professor C. Thiele at a concert in the Bbxy Theatre on Sunday night. Individual gold medals were also presented to the 36 bandmen by Mr. Thiele. The concert featured carols in which the audience participated in community singing. Mr. Thiele congratulated the town on voting a band grant and said that about 100 towns in Ontario had voted grants this year. Reeve Alex MacLaren was chairman for the program. Guest artists were Bill Doherty who sang "Holy Night" and "While Shepherds Watched" with Mrs. W. F. Bradley accompanying at the piano.
