Mr. Myers is a native of Guelph and served for four years with the Canadian army before joining the corporation. As administrator for Oakville, Acton and Georgetown, he will be "landlord" for the 48 tenants on Normandy Boulevard and will have charge of allocating the twenty-two new houses under construction in Reservoir Park. His office will remain in the present location on Colborne Street, Oakville.

### Canadian Jersey Adds To Her Record

Almonte Gentle Fern, 68128, a Jersey cow bred by F. A. C. Darling, Almonte, Ontario, and owned and tested by Featherstone Bros., Oakville, Ont., has completed her twelfth record, this time producing 12,182 lbs. of milk, 688 lbs. fat in 365 days with an average test of 5.65 per cent. This increases her long distance record to 122,488 lbs. milk, 6,853 lbs. fat. Her last record was started when she was 15 years of age and makes her the fifth highest long distance producing cow for butterfat in the Jersey Breed in Canada.
