## ALBERT SIMSON OPENS PHOTOGRAPHIC BUSINESS

A Georgetown man, Albert Simson, has returned to town recently to open a photographic business which for the present he will operate from his home on Ontario St. Mr. Simson has just completed a year's course at the School of Photography at the Rehal Station School in Toronto.

A native of England, he came to Canada in 1924 and worked at several local mills, including Smith & Stone, from which he enlisted with the Governor General's Horse Guards for army service as a hand-mill. He proceeded to England with the unit, which later became part of the Canadian Armoured Corps and served four years overseas.

## Western Pioneer Was Esquasing Native

Mrs. John Shanks, a native of Silvercreek near Georgetown, passed away on January 10th at her home in Pettapiece, Manitoba, in her eighty-second year. Formerly Annie Graham, she was the last surviving member of a pioneer family which went west in 1882 and settled on the homestead at Pettapiece where last December 9th, she celebrated with her husband their sixtieth wedding anniversary.

Surviving besides her husband are two sons, Professor G. Lawson Shanks of Winnipeg and Pender on the home farm and two daughters, Mrs. G. R. Kite (Jannette) of Pettapiece and Laura of Strathclair, also four grandchildren. A grandson, Graham Kite, gave his life with the RCAF in the second World War.

The funeral on January 18th was conducted from Pettapiece United Church by Rev. F. W. Lee. Mrs. H. S. Wolstenholme sang "When the Day of Toll is Done." Pallbearers were Gordon Shanks and Noble Graham, nephews and H. M. Spearin, H. S. Wolstenholme, Mac Westwood and Robert Macdonald. Interment was made in the family plot in Pettapiece Cemetery.
