

IN THE MAIL BAG

Georgetown, Ontario,

Editor, Georgetown Herald,

Dear Sir:

May we take space in your valued paper to explain to the people of Georgetown why the use of the Old Town Hall must be restricted to organized Recreational groups.

Since the renovation of the Old Town Hall by the Council, members of the G.R.C. executive and the Recreational Director have been approached by representatives of various organizations for the use of the auditorium for meetings, dances, etc.

Due to the increased number of requests the Council feel that their policy in these instances should be made public. It has been decided that at no time should anyone use the Hall for anything other than organized recreation, under the jurisdiction of the Recreational Council.

The reasons for this decision are enumerated below:

1. The Old Town Hall has been fitted out for the specific purpose of providing organized recreation for the Town of Georgetown. Due to certain delays in repair and the installation of a heating system, operations have been, until the present, retarded. However with the heating system working properly as it should be within the next few days, the auditorium (the only room suitable for meetings, etc.) will be in almost continuous use by the parent organization and affiliated Recreational bodies.

2. The Provincial Government subsidizes the work carried on by the Council to the extent of twenty per cent of the annual expenditure, but specifies that equipment purchased or buildings used by the G.R.C. must be used ONLY for recreational purposes. By allowing the use of the Hall to other groups, one-fifth of the yearly income would be lost — a loss that could not possibly make up.

3. The insurance on the Old Town Hall covers only the building when used for recreational purposes and to use it otherwise would mean a Public Hall license would be necessary. The price of insurance coverage on a Public Hall would be prohibitive.

4. Some \$1500 in equipment is stored in the auditorium, for present lack of storage space. As the building wears and tear on this could mean eventual replacement, the financial loss would be too great for a comparatively young organization such as G.R.C.

It is to allow one group to use the Hall, and to be forced to refuse another, if a hall would be unfair to all.

We trust that this will help the citizens of Georgetown understand our position regarding the use of the Old Town Hall and that organizations seeking meeting places will seek other alternatives having Public Hall facilities.
