\$85 WAS TOTAL FIRE LOSS HERE IN 1947

An outstanding record was chalked up in Georgetown last year with total fire loss being only \$85 in five minor fires which speaks well for the good work of the Fire Brigade and the safety measures of the citizenry in general. The loss was computed as follows: Mr. Diggins (roof), \$25; Bowers Motor Sales (pitch barrel), \$38; Georgetown Dairy (roof), \$10; Mrs. J. E. Lackey (stove, pipes), \$10; George Blanchard (curtains), \$5. The only major blaze fought by the Brigade was a \$2500 fire at Hunter's Inn in February, but as this is outside town limits it is not included in the Georgetown statistics. An out-of-town trip was also made on New Year's Eve to the Glen Textiles mill in Glen Williams.

Other fire calls during the year included: Cedarvale School (water front); B. Sorrell (stove pipe); Meadowlark Growers (grass fire); Mrs. Burgess (fence); Town Dump; Miss H. A. Stainton (bushes); Wildwood (two chimneys to a grass fire); W. T. Sinclair (oil stove); Maple Avenue (automobile). In none of these cases was loss reported.

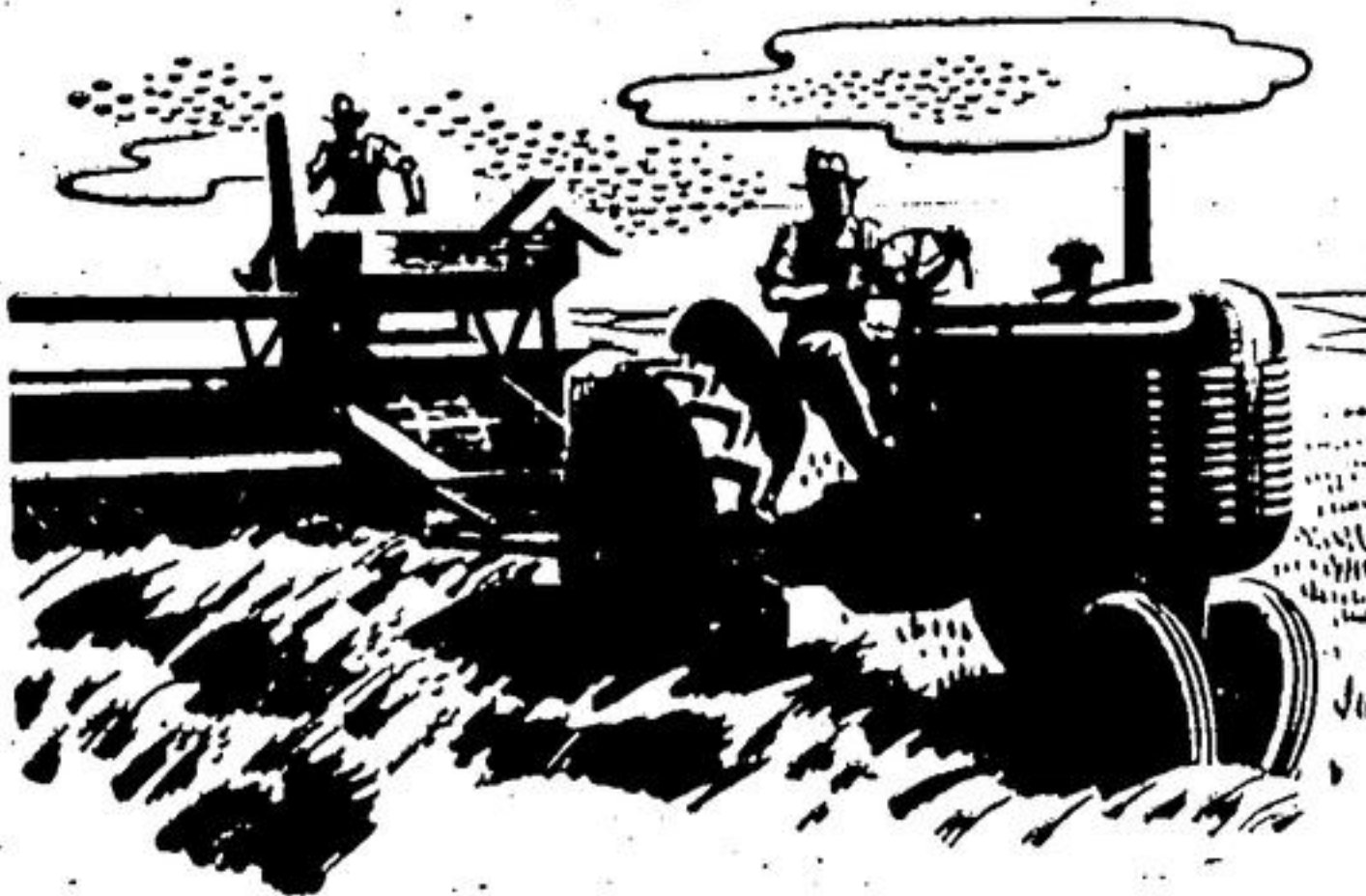
