Mrs. Meredith served lunch after the meeting.

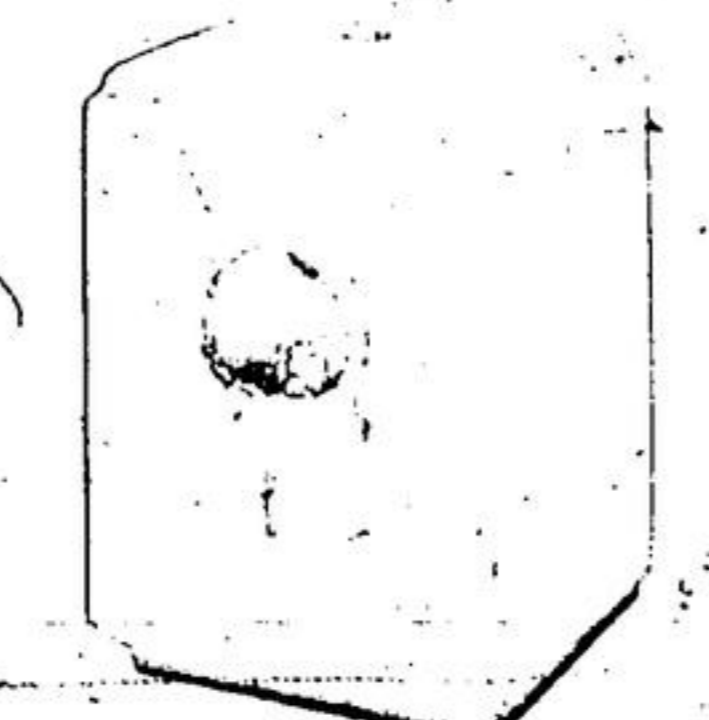
