In your report of the Council meeting of February 11th, your statement "Inspector Knight said that the Provincials would not sanction speed traps and that there was little police could do about speeding other than to caution motorists against driving recklessly," if taken at its face value is an open invitation all traffic violators to disobey Stop signs, No Parking, 20 and 30 mile per hour zone signs, etc., without fear of police action being taken against them.

While it is difficult to gain a conviction on traffic infractions, it is far from impossible, as several recent Main Street parking offenders will testify to their financial sorrow.

The police have no desire to browbeat motorists into obeying traffic laws, but they do expect drivers to use care, courtesy and common sense at all times to avoid accidents and inconvenience to others.
