

**Ken McMillan Tells Lions of Hockey Trip**

Mr. Nicholas, Glamorgan, Wales. This man is aged 67 and his wife is a year older. He works for the Council as a road man. Mr. Nicholas has to prepare all meals and look after his wife who is mentally unbalanced. Very pathetic case, no relatives living near enough to help.

**CANADIAN HOLSTEIN IS WORLD CHAMPION**

A new World record for milk production in the 305 day (ten months) class on three-times-a-day milking has been completed by a Canadian Holstein. She is Montvic Hiemke Abbekerk, owned by J. J. McCague, Alliston, Ontario, and her 305 day record made as a six-year-old is 28,243 lbs. milk containing 980 lbs. fat. Particular attention is focused on this record since in most well ordered dairy farms every effort is made to have the cows freshen approximately once a year and production records thus come in

the ten months class. Actually Montvic Hiemke Abbekerk calved just 365 days after the start of her record-breaking lactation and adding still further lustre to her achievement is the fact that she was carrying twin calves, a bull and a heifer, while on test.

Continued on test for 336 days, Hiemke Abbekerk produced 28,519 lbs. milk containing 1005 lbs. fat. Her 305 day fat production of 980 lbs. is a new North American record for the Holstein breed in the mature class and replaces as Canadian champion over all breeds the Ayshire Nellie Osborne, of Elm Shade 16th with her record of 909 lbs. fat from 2124 lbs. milk. The displaced world champion milk producer for 305 days is the U.S.A. Holstein, Homstata Bess, Pontiac 11th with 27,613 lbs. milk.

Just a month ago Lynn Pabst Susie owned by Herman K. Bodkin, St. Thomas, established a new Canadian record for the Holstein breed in this class with 887 lbs. fat which of course, is now replaced by that of Montvic Hiemke Abbekerk.

The former Canadian champion for milk production was Canary Korndyke Alcatraz owned by B. H. Thomson, Moose Jaw, Sask. who made her record of 26,396 lbs. milk containing 1080 lbs. fat back in 1928 as a Senior four-year-old. Incidentally she and Abegweit Milady owned by Premier J. Walter Jones of Prince Edward Island, are the only two Canadian cows to exceed the fat record of Montvic Hiemke Abbekerk for 305 days. Milady made her record of 1085 lbs. fat as a Junior four-year-old on three-times-a-day milking.

The new champion comes by her producing ability honestly, being a daughter of the \$18,000 sire Itaymondale Ideal Successor and thus a paternal sister of the five times All-Canadian bull "Marksmen" and of Montvic Hiemke Rag Apple Pat, the world Champion butterfat producer in the Senior four-year-old class of the 365 day division on three-times-a-day milking with her record of 1168 lbs. fat from 24,466 lbs. milk. A two-year-old daughter of Montvic Hiemke Abbekerk was the top female at the 1947 All-Canadian Sale bringing \$3,550 on the bid of Roselawn Farms, Richmond Hill, Ontario.
