Alice is a daughter of the famous Rockalda Volunteer Vivian, Reserved Grand Champion at the last Royal Winter Fair and winner of many other prizes including a member of the First Prize Progeny of Dam at the Royal. Mr. Hower has had many tempting offers for Rockalda Aim's Alice but he feels that she should stay in his own herd.
