Former Resident of Nassagaweya C. C. F. Candidate

From a list of six nominees, Ed Adamson of Oakville was chosen as candidate for the C.C.F. party in the coming election. The meeting for this nomination took place in the Princess Theatre, Milton, on May 5. Mr. Adamson is a native of Nassagaweya, but for some time now has been a resident of Oakville, where he is closely identified with the labour movement.

Chairman was Carlyle C. Browne of Burlington. Mr. Adamson addressed the meeting, outlining briefly the midway course the C.C.F. party was taking between the two ideologies so prevalent in the press today. With Capitalism on one hand and Communism on the other, Social Democracy would be the aim of the steadily growing C. C. F. He emphasized the great need of the close co-operation of the farmer and the labourer. Their problems are identical.

Mr. Bert Shave drew attention to the fact that the steam generating plants, advocated by the present government, would be hopelessly outmoded before they were built. Uranium, he said would be available to provide the necessary power within three years.

Ted Joliffe, C.C.F. party leader, was guest speaker. His references to the splendid record of what the Saskatchewan government had done for farmers, gave the lie to the two foolish assertions of both of the old parties, that the C.C.F. would take the farmer's land away from him. As a matter of fact, the Saskatchewan Government is the only one helping farmers to keep their farms. Besides this, while farmers compose the bigger part of the legislature, the Saskatchewan province has the best labour laws in the world. He referred to the shameful monopoly on Fertilizer — so essential to the farmer today. Profiteering, so prevalent today, would be attacked mercilessly by a C.C.F. government in Ontario. The high prices charged by electrical equipment companies were a disgrace. He drew a laugh when he said that Westinghouse and General Electric would not vote C.C.F. The slogan adopted for the present campaign by the C.C.F. party is 'People First.'

No issues should be allowed to cloud the real issues — the Health, Welfare, Comfort and Living Standard of The People.

Oakville Mayor Prominent In Fraternal Circles

Stricken with a heart attack last Thursday, Alfred E. Whitaker, mayor of Oakville, died Monday at the Oakville Hospital. He had been in ill health for some months, but had continued active in his civic duties.

Prominent in business, he was head of the firm, William Whitaker Senior, plumbing and heating services. He had been associated with numerous community activities. Mr. Whitaker was born in Oakville, son of the late William Whitaker and attended local public and high schools. He entered the plumbing business, founded by his father, whom he succeeded as manager of the firm. He was elected to the Oakville Town Council in 1939, filling the office left vacant by the retirement of his brother, the late Jack Whitaker. He continued a member of council, receiving acclamations for three terms. He was acclaimed deputy mayor, reeve, and in December, 1947, mayor.

Mr. Whitaker was a member of Oakville Lodge, AY and AM, White Oak Chapter, RAM, and was a Shriner. He was a member of St. Jude's Anglican Church, Oakville, Sports Association and was a past president of the Lions Club. He was secretary of the Citizen's band, with which he had been connected for 29 years.

Surviving are his widow, the former Ella Mayhew; three children, Bill, Marjory and Eloise; his mother, Mrs. William Whitaker; two sisters, Mrs. S. C. Robertson and Mrs. Allan Morden, and a brother, William Whitaker, all of Oakville. His brother, Jack, died in July, 1946, and a sister, Marjory, a missionary of the United Church, died in 1940 in India.

Mr. Whitaker's wife is a former Georgetown resident. He had often visited the local Lions Club and was a guest here a few months ago when the District Governor paid his official visit to the club.
