

**U. of T. Research Centre Named for Dr. C. H. Best**

A new medical research centre planned for the University of Toronto as part of its \$13,000,000 development program will be known as Best, co-discoverer of insulin, is the Charles H. Best Institute. Dr. Best, co-discoverer of insulin, is director of the Banting and Best Department of Medical Research and head of the Department of Physiology at the University. He is well known locally and maintains a summer home just out of town, back of the golf course.

Dr. Best, who is not yet 50 years old, is one of Canada's most widely known men. The list of his honours, scientific appointments and publications requires 30 standard pages of typescript. Last year alone he received honorary degrees from Oxford, the University of Amsterdam, the University of Liege, the Medal of Freedom of the University of Brussels, the Medal of the University of Louvain; was made a member of the Legion of Merit by the United States Government, and was granted the Liberty Cross by King Haakon of Norway.

He integrates lectures with an active role in various scientific organizations and supervision of 30 research projects now being carried out by 40 scientists within his department. He is a member of the National Research Council and president elect of the American Diabetes Association. During the war he was director of medical research of the Royal Canadian Navy.

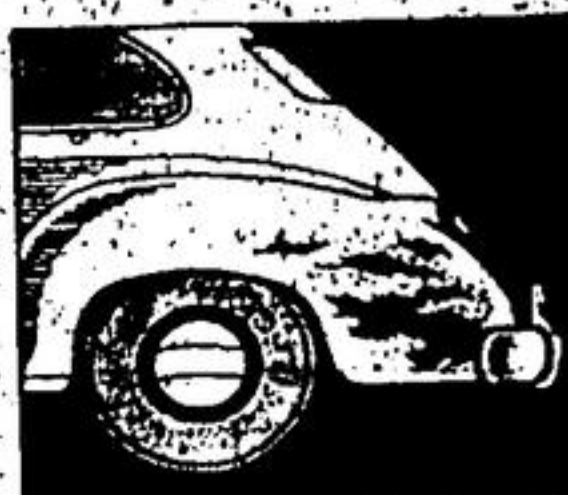
**ASHGROVE**
