

Catholic Boys, School on Moyer Farm

The former Moyer farm on the 8th Line just out of town is now Notre Dame de Beauregard, a Catholic boys' farm-school. The property has been purchased by. Father Clovis Beauregard, a Catholic priest who operated a similar establishment at St. Cutherines for twelve years. There is accommodation from from twenty French boys who take some classroom work, including Bnglish, and and taught the glements of farming. Boys are orphans or come from homes where family life has been disrupted and occasionally, in order to keep the children of one family together, their sisters are taken in almo at the school. Father Behuregard was in Culgary for eight years before going to St, Catherines and at one time was engaged with the Dopartment of Colonization in Quebec province. Directress of the school is Miss Therese St. Jean who, held a similar position in St. Catharines.
