No examinations will be written on Monday, June 14th. The revised time-table FOR ALL CANDIDATES reads as follows:

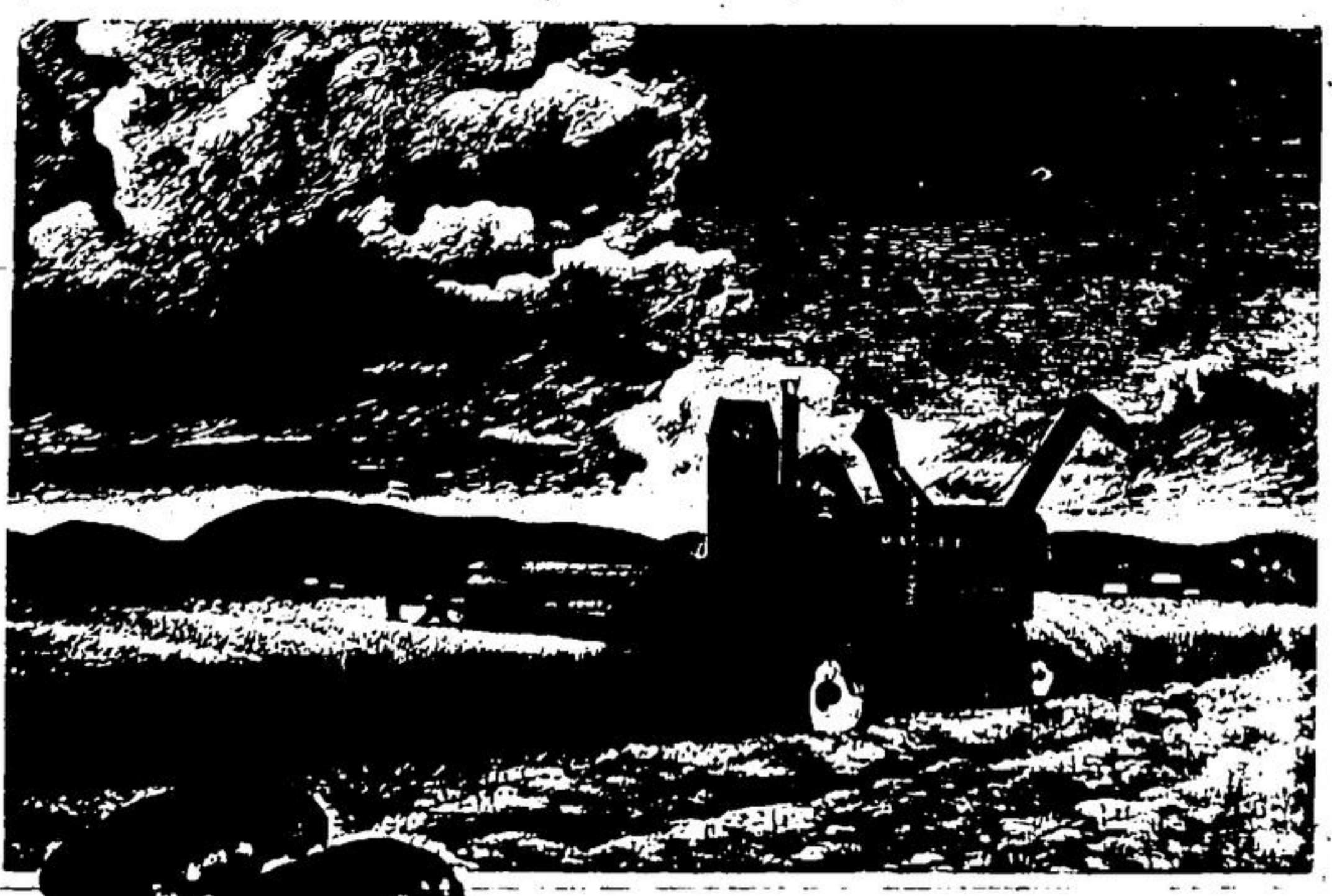

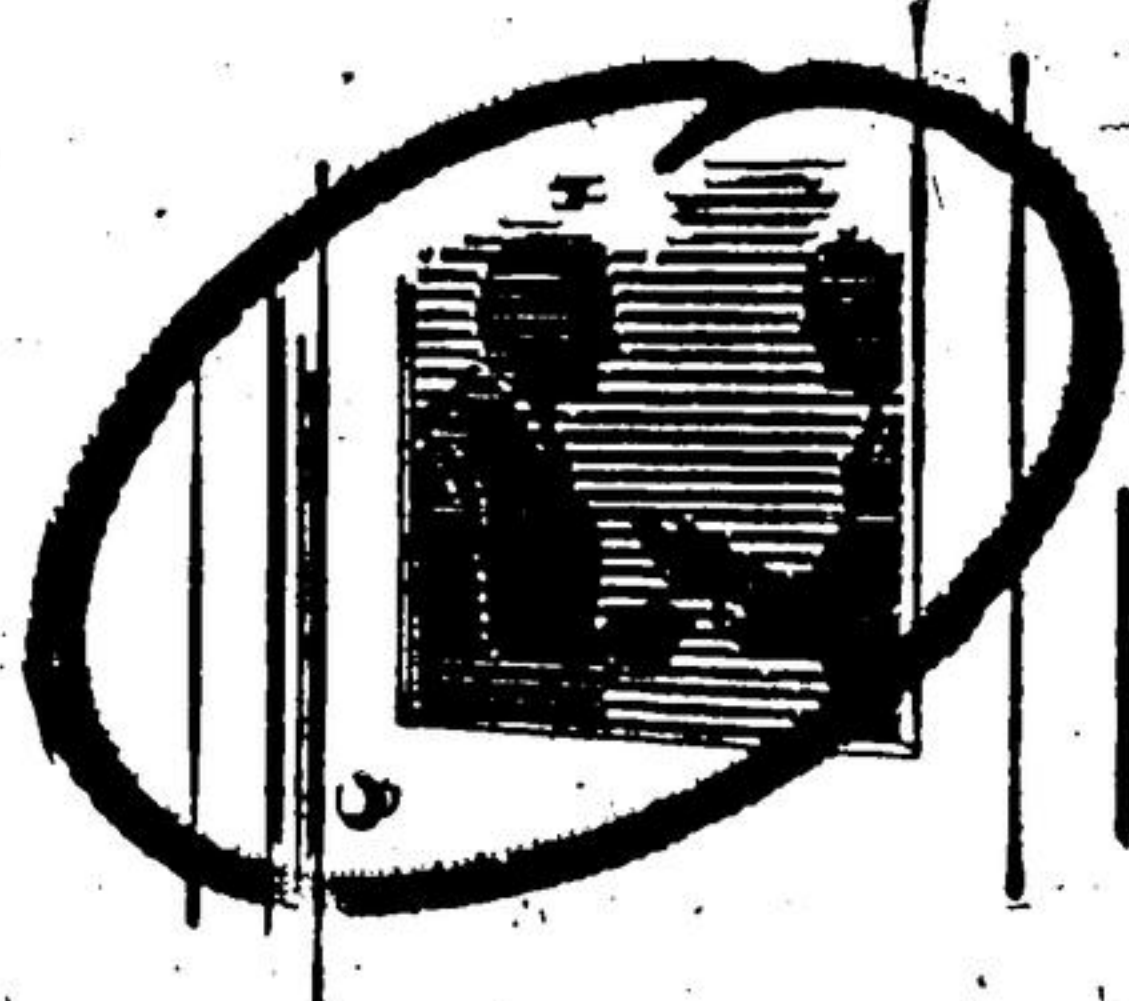
