Building Permit

is required in the

Town of Georgetown

for all buildings in the course of erection or alteration, as outlined in paragraph 1 of Building By-Law No. 489 of the Town of Georgetown, which read as follows:

"The erection or alteration or the removal or moving of any buildings or part of any buildings shall not be commenced in the Town of Georgetown until a permit for such erection or alteration or removal shall have been obtained from the Council of the Town of Georgetown or from the Inspector of Buildings by the owner or the owner's agent and no such owner or agent shall proceed with the erection or alteration or removal of any building or part of any building until such permit has been obtained."

It is the intention of Council to enforce this By-Law by police supervision of necessary.
