**Georgetown Lose Three Straight
in Halton Baseball Loop**

The Georgetown baseball club lost their third game in a row. Playing no favorites, after losing to Oakville and Acton, they completed the circuit by dropping last Saturday's game to Milton by a score of 12 to 5. As far as actual baseball went, the game was sadly lacking in everything. The base umpire was evidently not too accustomed to baseball and didn't seem to know whether or not a runner was safe or out. Some of his calls were quite rough. It was partly on this that Hal Gibson after a heated argument with umpire Whiteman was ejected, not only from the game but also from the park in the 4th inning. As he passed the grandstand, the Milton supporters had an opportunity of releasing their pent-up energy against Gibson who certainly was a thorn in the Milton side all winter.
