McCormie who has not pitched ball since 1940 has had only one practice this year and he went out and pitched 7 hit ball, staying the full 7 innings. 1st Innings
Norton struck out. Wilson singled to centre. With Gibson batting, Wilson stole 2nd. Gibson singled through 3rd, Wilson going to 3rd. With Storey batting, Gibson stole 2nd. Storey grounded out with Wilson scoring on the play and Gibson going to 3rd. Scott singled to left scoring Gibson. Patterson walked. Inches singled to left scoring Scott. Spence struck out.

3 runs—4 hits—0 errors
Masters hit a ground ball to the pitcher who fumbled the ball for an error. Jordan struck out. Wat-

erhouse grounded to Gibson who muffed the ball for an error, both runners being safe. Masters went to 3rd. With Storey batting, Gibson batting, Waterhouse stole 2nd. Lindsay walked to load the bases. Footit fled out to left with Masters scoring after the play, with the other runners advancing. Allan singled scoring. Waterhouse and Lindsay to tie up the ball game. Robinson struck out.

McCormie lined out to 2nd. Norton was hit by the pitcher and went to 1st. With Wilson batting, Norton stole 2nd. Wilson grounded to the short stop who fumbled the ball for an error with Norton going to 3rd on the play. With Gibson batting, Wilson stole 2nd. Gibson singled scoring Norton and Wilson. Storey walked. Scott fouled out to left, with both runners holding. Patterson walked. Inches lined out to left field.

R. Ryder walked and then went to second on a pass ball as D. Ryder was batting. D. Ryder struck out. Masters grounded to 3rd. Scott made the out by tagging R. Ryder between 3rd and 2nd. Masters was safe on the fielder's choice. Jordan singled to left. With Waterhouse batting, McCormie threw a pass ball with Masters go-

ing to 3rd. Jordan then stole 2nd. Waterhouse singled to left scoring Masters and Jordan. On a fast relay from left field, Waterhouse was trapped off 1st base. The out was 1st to 2nd to short.

Wilson walked. With Gibson batting, Wilson stole 2nd. Gibson struck out. Storey singled scoring Wilson. With Scott batting, Storey started for 2nd, with catcher Lindsay throwing the ball into centre field for an error. Storey went to 3rd on the play. Scott fled out to left with Storey scoring after the catch. Patterson popped out to short.

2 runs—1 hit—1 error
Jordan batted for Robinson and grounded out, short to 1st. R. Ryder fled out to left. D. Ryder struck out.

5th Innings
Jordan replaced Robinson in right field for Acton. Inches struck out. Spence struck out. McCormie grounded to Allan at 1st who muffed the ball for an error. With Norton batting McCormie attempted to steal 2nd but was thrown out by Lindsay.

Masters grounded to short who threw to 1st. However Patterson pulled his foot off the bag before catching the ball for an error. Jordan singled to centre with Masters going to 3rd. Jordan stole second as Waterhouse was batting. Waterhouse singled to left scoring Masters with Jordan going to 3rd. With Lindsay batting Waterhouse went to 2nd. Lindsay hit a very slow dribbler to the pitcher for a hit with the runners holding. Footit popped to short. Morton batted for Allan and struck out. Jordan lined out to Storey at short who made a great one handed stab to snare the ball.

Snyder went in to pitch for Acton and Morton went to 1st. Norton singled to centre. Wilson fled out to centre. Gibson struck out. Storey forced Norton at 2nd.

R. Ryder fled out to left. Snyder grounded out, pitcher to 1st. Masters grounded to 3rd who fumbled the ball for an error. Jordan singled to left with Masters going to 3rd. With Waterhouse batting, McCormie tried to catch Masters off 3rd but when he turned to throw the ball, no one was there to receive it. This was called a balk with Masters scoring and Jordan going to 2nd. This tied up the ball game. Waterhouse ended the innings by grounding out, short to 1st.

7th Innings
Scott singled. Patterson forced Scott at 2nd with Patterson being safe on the fielder's choice. Inches fled out to left. With Spence at bat, Patterson went for 2nd. Lindsay threw the ball into centre field for an error with Patterson going to 3rd. Spence grounded out 2nd to 1st.

Lindsay struck out. Lindsay looked bad on this one as the last strike was a high "Luke Hamlin" blooper pitch. It was a slow ball that looked as if it was never going to reach the plate but it floated down over and Lindsay took a terrific cut at the ball and missed it. If he had connected with the ball, it probably still would be travelling. Footit grounded out to 1st unassisted. Morton walked. Jordan fled out to centre to end the game.

And so the game ended in a 7-all tie. Georgetown should have won this one, but due to the errors, McCormie's seven hit game went to no avail. Things like Masters, the Acton 3rd baseman who was up 4 times, he got on base safely each time, 3 times or errors and once on a fielder's choice, and he scored every time. That was enough to win the ball game right there. However probably the best player for the local team was Lindsay the Acton catcher. He almost atoned for all Georgetown errors with his pegging to 2nd and 3rd bases, which were from an Acton standpoint, any place but where they should

have been. With all 4 teams in the play-offs, it is doubtful if this game will be replayed.
