**Average of \$1294 at National Holstein Sale**

A total of \$73,800 was realized on the sale of 57 head of purebred Holsteins for a general average of \$1,294 at the National Holstein Sale held May 31 at Oakville. This is the second highest average ever achieved at the National, being exceeded only by the \$1,509 figure established in 1946. However, in 1946 there were several exceptionally high prices that boosted the average while this year there were no really outstanding prices but a total of 29, more than half of the entries, sold for at least \$1,000.

The National has been the top spring Holstein sale in Canada since it was established in 1918. The highest price of \$5,000 was received by J. E. McCague, Alliston, Ont., for a six-months-old bull calf, Glenafton Kinsman, the buyer being Richard E. Ross, Gowanda, N.Y. "Kinsman" is an in-bred son of the five times All-Canadian "Marksmen." McCague also received the highest price for a female, \$3,100 for the four-year-old Glenafton Laurel Dolly, the purchaser being W. K. MacLeod, Thetford Mines, Que. "Dolly" is also by "Marksmen." Another "Marksmen" son consigned by C. J. Cerwell, Beeton, brought \$3,000 on the bid of a syndicate of Oxford County breeders composed of G. R. Row, Curries, Allan H. Gilmour, Burgessville and Douglas Hart, Woodstock.

Second highest price of the day was \$3,600 paid by Albert Stagg of International Livestock Exporters, Toronto, to H. L. Guilbert, Vercheres, Que., for Eglantiers Emperor Charon, a four-months-old bull calf. This bull was bought for shipment to Italy. Elmeroft Tradition, three-months-old bull calf consigned by Elmeroft Farm, Oshawa, did not leave Ontario County as he was purchased by a local syndicate consisting of O. Chambers, Wilfrid, Thomas Flett and Son, Oshawa and Hugh Ormiston Brooklin. He is by the \$14,000 "Marksmen" son, Aladdin and out of the excellent cow Montvic Duchesse Abbecker.

Top price for a bred heifer was \$2,650 received by Albert Stagg for Springvale Sovereign Arlene sired by the noted "Sovereign" and out of a daughter of Springvale Irene Canary Echo who was classified as "Excellent in Selective Registration at 16 years of age at which age she also completed a record of 853 lbs. butterfat, the highest ever reported for a cow that old or older. The purchaser was G. D. Lozia of Sunny Vale Farm, Lafayette, N. J. Another "Sovereign" daughter topped the open yearlings, bringing \$2,500 on the bid of J. A. Suttin, Visalia, California. She is Bond Haven Sovereign Duchess consigned by C. J. Cerwell, Beeton, and out of a "Marksmen" daughter. J. A. McDowell, Oxford Centre, sold a pair of "Sovereign" granddaughters for \$2,200 and \$1,500, the former being Centre View Sovereign Bally the All-Canadian and Reserve All-American heifer calf for 1947. Bally was sold to Richard B. Ross, of Gowanda, N. Y., and her sister to J. A. Suttin, Visalia, Cal.

Other high prices included \$2,000 paid by J. A. Suttin to H. J. McFarland, Picton, Ont. for a three-months-old bull calf; \$2,000 paid by J. A. Suttin to Gordon Innes, Woodstock, Ont. for a bred heifer; \$1,700 paid by Dr. W. D. Platt, Terra Cotta, to Emerson Chambers, Hatchley Sta. for the "Excellent" cow Ideal Pride Margaret; \$1,700 paid by J. M. Fraser, Streetsville, to W. D. Fraser, Streetsville, for a bred heifer; \$1,850 paid by G. D. Lozia, Sunny Vale Farm, to J. E. Houck, Brampton, for Wyn-D-Lyn Sovereign Jean the 1947 Reserve All-Canadian Heifer Calf; and \$1,500 paid by Roselawn Farms, Richmond Hill, to E. J. Meagher, Oakville, for a bred heifer.

A crowd of over 2,000 attended the sale, these including buyers from Chile, Great Britain and all parts of Canada and the United States.

Seven bulls sold for an average of \$2814; 7 milking females \$1246; 31 bred heifers, \$1066; 11 open yearlings, \$1011 and 1 heifer calf, \$4050. The Sales Manager was L. E. Franklin, Toronto.

Dr. Paul Beer, Georgetown, paid \$1100 to C. A. Hogg, Thamesford, for a bred heifer. She is a daughter of Montvic Lochivar Chieftain, All-Canadian Jr. Yearling in 1943 and her dam is a Very Good cow with a twice-a-day milking record of 15,767 lbs. of milk containing 683 lbs. fat, average test 4.38 per cent.
