J. A. Denny New Manager Of UIC Brampton Office

J. A. Denny, formerly manager of the Fergus office of the Unemployment Insurance Commission, has assumed his duties as manager of the Brampton office, effective July 2nd. He replaces R. C. Godfrey who has been acting manager of the local office since the resignation of Clarence Wiggins last May 31.

Mr. Denny, who has been employed by the commission for the past four years, was president of the Fergus branch of the Canadian Legion for the past 18 months, and a member of the Fergus Chamber of Commerce. He feels he has a sound knowledge of veterans' problems and needs as a result of his experience in the Legion and the army. He went overseas with the Ordinance Corps in the last war, but was repatriated and later discharged for medical reasons.

He is particularly noted for his enthusiasm in promoting good-will and cooperation between employers and workers, says Mr. Godfrey, and he is anxious to establish contacts at once with employers in Brampton and district.

Mr. Denny, whose home is in Fergus, is the father of four girls and one boy. He hopes to have his wife and family join him as soon as he is settled in his new job.
