This is, in effect an unwillingness to admit the rights of others. It is a form of selfishness strikingly in evidence in traffic accidents. Impatience, or lack of patience, is the cause of a great many industrial accidents too. Men do not want to be bothered using a guard. They can't take time to get glasses to protect their eyesight. They are in too much of a hurry to get the right tools from the tool crib. They want to get on with the job and are impatient with anything that they think holds them back. They fail to realize that accidents are holding up jobs every day all across the country, that accidents are losing more time than all the caution in the world and that after all, the right way is the safe way to do the job.
