

Junior Lacrosse Tilt at Norval Friday

Making their first appearance at Norval this season the Brampton-Norval Combines, only district entrant in Junior Lacrosse will play at Norval this Friday. ARCHDEACON THOMPSON ASSISTS IN FERGUS CHURCH DEDICATION

With appropriate ceremonies, the newly-built Church of St. James the Apostle, which will serve the Anglican parish of Fergus was formally opened on Sunday afternoon. Archdeacon W. G. O. Thompson of Georgetown in his capacity as Archdeacon of the Denery took a prominent part in proceedings by declaring the church open for Divine worship, while a former minister, Rev. C. J. Loat, now of St. Catharines, preached the sermon. Rev. J. H. Ferris, Rural Dean of Wellington, read the lesson and the present rector, Rev. R. P. E. Joffares also took part in the service.

The new building replaces the old church which was built in 1895 and sold in 1945 to the Farmer's Cooperative Association of Fergus. The parish has been in existence since 1852, when it was founded by the Rev. J. N. Smithurst and consists of 95 adherent families, comprising about 317 persons. Fergus and Elora are amalgamated and the rector makes his home in Elora.

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
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
