IS YOUR CHILD READY FOR SCHOOL

A circular distributed to parents of children who will attend school year for the first time, has been distributed by the Halton Heelth Unit. It saks various questions about the preparations parents have made and suggests ways they see help them training. Here is what the circular says:

A child's training during his preschool years lays a foundation for his future health and development. His enjoyment and progress at school are largely dependent upon good physical health and early home training.

All children are imitators. Many babits are learned in their homes and in the neighbourhood. As your child will be entering school this fall, we suggest that you consider the following points: 1. Has your child been checked by your family physician. It is advisable to have an early physical ememination to allow ample time der the correction of defects before he begins school. 


