PROTECT THE CHILDREN OF YOUR COMMUNITY FROM THE HAZARDS OF FIRE

This is the first in a series of two articles on the protection of children from fire submitted by The Children's Aid Society of the County of Halton, in conjunction with a campaign sponsored by the Provincial Association of Children's Aid Societies.

Is your child ever left at home alone? "Oh no," you say, "I would never leave Jimmy alone. Not for any length of time, that is. Of course, sometimes I do have to run down to the store for some groceries and once in a while I step across the street to speak to Mrs. Jones for a minute. But nothing could ever happen to him in that short a time."

That is where you are wrong, Mother. Do you remember reading in the newspapers last Winter about the many tragedies in which children were burned to death? Five of these fires in Ontario, occurred while the children were left alone for just a few minutes. The mother had gone only a short distance from the home on what seemed to her a necessary errand or chore. One mother went to the well for a pail of water, another was shovelling snow, another ran to the neighbor's house, another went to the corner grocery store. The result? During the 1944-48 winter months at least 12 children, left unattended in the home, were fatally burned; and many others suffered severe injury.

It is only after such tragedies that a parent realizes that some expedient could have been used to avoid leaving a small child alone in the home even for a few minutes. If this precaution is established as an unbreakable rule, some way can be found to circumvent what seems to be a necessity. Whenever a child is left alone he is exposed to many hazards, and in the Winter-time one of the most dangerous of these is fire.

Children are sometimes left in charge of a young girl, or of an elder brother or sister, while the parents go out for the evening. Very often these boys and girls are too young to have such a responsibility, and the risk is as great as though the young children were all alone.

Don't take chances with your children's safety. When you leave your children at home, always make sure they are in the care of a competent, responsible adult.

Protect your little ones from every hazard that stalks children left unattended anywhere. Particularly at this season set up your precautions against FIRE IN THE HOME.
