RESOLVED TO HALT ON FARMERS

W. E. BRECKON TOPS HALTON FIFTY BUSHEL WINTER WHEAT COMPETITION

The Field Husbandry Department of Ontario Agricultural College recently released the yields for the winter wheat fields in Halton entered in the Fifty Bushel Club sponsored by the Halton Crop Improvement Association. These yields are based on small plots cut in mid July in the sixteen Halton competitors' fields. It is worthy of note that W. E. Breckon of Freeman whose field was declared the best field on field score by Ray Abrogast of Perth County, was again high on yield with 49.5 bus. per acre. The variety was Cornell 595 which is the variety in strong demand in most sections of central and western Ontario. Wm. Booth of Milton, with another field of the Cornell variety, was in second place. Other high scoring fields follow in order: 3rd M. T. Watson of Freeman and Gordon Leslie, Acton, tied with a yield of 4.81 bus.; 5th, Ken Watson, Milton; 6th, J. H. Willmott, Milton; 7th, a tie between Wm. Lucas and A. M. Sherwood, both of Freeman.

The three high competitors, namely W. E. Breckon, Wm. G. Booth, and M. T. Watson, who had the highest combined score for yield and field scores, will represent Halton in the inter-county competition at the Royal Winter Fair.

Entries are now being received at the Agricultural Office, Milton, for a similar competition for 1949. The rules and regulations call for a minimum of five acres in one block and must be grown from one of the following: Reg. No. 1 Dawson's Golden Chaff, seed grown from Reg. No. 1 Dawson's or Commercial No. 1 Cornell 595. Further details can be secured at the Agricultural Office, Milton, upon request.
