HALTON GARAGE OPERATORS HAVE PERMAFUSE DEMONSTRATION

At their September meeting the Garage Operators' and their employees were given a demonstration of the new Permafuse method of brake bonding. This new method eliminates the use of rivets as a means of attaching the lining to the brake shoes.

This new process requires a thorough cleaning of the old drums by means of burring and then an application of bonding cement and a special tape. The brake lining is then clamped to the shoe and is put in a Permafuse machine which is an automatically regulated oven where they brake shoes are baked for one-half hour at 300 degrees F.

Several of the automobile manufacturers are using this method on their new cars as it gives a longer service from the brake lining and eliminates brake drum scouring from rivets.

The meeting was sponsored by Garage Supply Co. of Toronto and Raybestos Brake Lining who provided very capable demonstrators in the person of Mr. H. Baldwin, E. Butson, Frank O'Brien and Jim Graham.
