In an exciting game played Saturday night at Brampton Rose Bowl, Ebenezer Juniors Farmers captured the Blain Trophy by defeating Norval in the fifth game of the play-offs. Mr. Cameron gets credit for developing the Norval team into a smooth-clicking organization, and at a team get-together at his home after the game, he was praised by the players for his efforts in leading Norval into the finals.

In the third period, Louth scored on a pass from Campbell and Cleave on a pass from Louth. Boynton scored twice, and Roe and Pranski once each in the Ebenezer rally with Campbell scoring Norval's fourth goal. Mr. Blain, who donated the trophy, was present to face off the ball in the opening period.

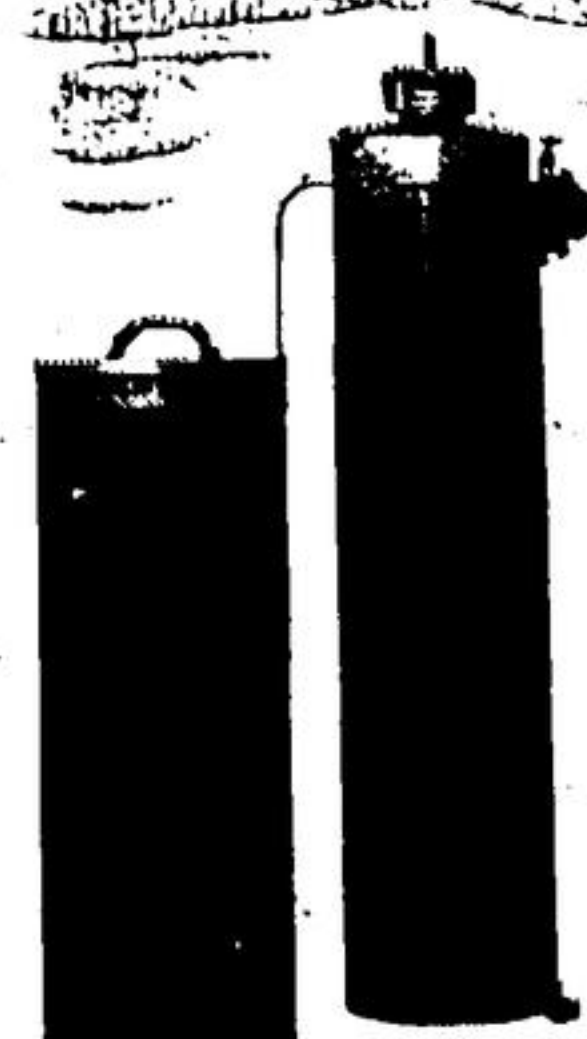
