FIRE PROTECTION

This is the second in a series of two articles on the protection of children from fire submitted by The Children's Aid Society of the County of Halton, in conjunction with a campaign sponsored by the Provincial Association of Children's Societies.

You can protect your children against death and injury by fire! More than half the fires and most deaths from fire occur in the home. Latest statistics released by W. J. Scott, K.C. Fire Marshal of Ontario, show that in 1946, 13,715 Ontario dwellings caught fire. Forty-four children were killed and 20 seriously injured.

As was pointed out last week, a good many fires occur while children are left alone in the home. The first step, then, in the protection of your children from fire is to ensure that they are never left unattended, even for a few minutes.

But death and injury to children by fire are not confined to those who have been left alone. Last winter many adults were trapped with their children when fires broke out in dwelling places during the night and gained headway while the family was sleeping.

The fire Marshal has made available to the Association of Children's Aid Societies of Ontario the following simple precautions, which if heeded, could prevent practically all fires in the home:

Keep matches out of children's hands. Place used matches in incombustible trays. Keep "strike anywhere" matches in closed metal boxes. "Safety" matches are safest. Extinguish smokes and matches before discarding. Be sure they are cold.

Keep trash and rubbish cleaned out especially in the basement, attics and closets. Burn safely and never on windy days. Use rubbish burners in built up areas. Watch fires till out.

Have flues and heating plants cleaned, examined and repaired if necessary once a year. Protect exposed woodwork with incombustible shields or mats. Do not pass stovepipes through ceilings, roofs or wooden partitions. Never over-heat.

Use metal flue stops. Do not paper over flue holes or stuff with rags.

Use only metal receptacles for ashes. Do not dump hot ashes against anything which can burn.

Do not store Gasoline, Benzine or Naphtha on home premises. Gasoline has explosive power equal to 83 lbs. of dynamite.

Do not use Kerosine to start fire. Flash-backs and explosions kill and maim scores yearly.

Have a licensed electrician do all electrical work and repairs. Do not use lamp cord for circuit extensions or hang over nails.

Use 15 ampere fuses for ordinary circuits. Never plug blow fuses with pennies, nor replace with oversize fuses.

Always disconnect current before leaving electric irons. Replace gas tubing with rigid pipe.

Protect gas plates underneath with asbestos covered metal. Do not have open lights, lamps near curtains or combustible material.

Do not place flimsy or combustible decorations over electric light globes or near open lights or heaters.

Keep oily lamps in a closed metal can. Destroy rags — they ignite spontaneously.

Remember a careful person seldom has a fire; a clean orderly place seldom burns.

Check conditions and habits in your home today. The heating season is nearly upon us. Avoid tragedy! Protect your children!
