Rural X-Ray Clinics Held Next Week

From Monday, October -25th, to Friday, October 29th, the residents of the rural area of Halton County will have an opportunity for a free chest x-ray. This is part of the Dominion wide campuign for the control of tuberculosis and is, in part, financed by the purchase of Christmas scals: It is a cooperative effort of the Halton County Christmas Senl Committee, the Ontarlo Department of Health, The Ontario . Tuberculosts Association. the Halton County Federation of Agriculture and the Halton Coun-

ty Health Unit. A series of organization meetings have been held in all Townships and interested community groups will make thouse to house carvass to explain to the people. the need for a chest"x-ray. Clinics will be held at the following places:

Nelson Village, October 25th, 1.00 p.m.-5 p.m., Union School, Trufalgar (17 Ash.), October 25, 7 p.m.-10 p.m.; Kilbride, October 26th, p.m.-5 p.m.: Campbelville, Oc tober 26th, 7 p.m .- 10 p.m,; Brookville Hall, October 27th, 1 p.m. -5 p.m.; Limchouse Community Hall, October 27th, 7 p.m. - 10 p.ml.; Norval Community Hall, October 28th, 1 p.m.-5 p.m.; No. 9 Come School, October 28th, 7 p.m.

-10 p.m.; Palermo, October 29th, 1 p.m .- 5 p.m.; Bronte, October 29, 7 p.m.-10 p.m. At these clinics no appointment is necessary. Even though the canvasser may not call at your home, you are welcome to attend. There is no waiting. Over 100 per hour can be x-rayed at these clinics. There is no undressing. There

is no charge to anyone. Who should be x-rayed? Every adult should be done regardless of age. Even among very elderly people occasionally infectious cases of tuberculosis are found. Up to the level of 8th grade it is not considered necessary to x-ray children, since cases of tuberculosis of the lung are rarely found. However, if there has been any contact with a case of the disease, the child should be x-rayed. Children in 8th grade and above should be x-rayed since it is in this age. group that the cases most frequently appear. Many people were x-rayed in the survey carried out: in our towns last year. Have another x-ray of your chest done this year. A routine periodic x-ray is excellent insurance for your continued good health. Many i firms x-ray all their employees each year.

Why have an x-ray? Everyone should have a chest x-ray for two reasons. One is for your own protection, the other is for the good of the community. By x-ray, tuberculosis is found in its earliest stages, long before the individual is aware he is ill. When found at this stage the period of hospital care an t-loss of earning power is much reduced. If the individual goes on until he is ill enough to seek medical attention, his period' of stay in hospital will be greatly increased and, indeed it might be more difficult to cure the disease. By finding a case of tuberculosis early, the further spread of the disease from the patient to other persons in the community is prevented. Approximately 1000 Ontario citizens die each year with tuberculosis. They die because they are advanced cases and were x-rayed only after serious physical break-down. Had they been x-rayed in the early stages of the disease when they were feeling well and unaware of their condition, sanatorium treatment could have restored them to health, family and happiness.

Here, then, is your opportunity for a free chest x-ray. You will not have a similar chance in this county for another four or five years. Be wise, take advantage of this service.


