MAIN STREET GEORGETOWN

Laymen's Association
Formed at St. George's

Halton Deanery, which comprises the Anglican parishes in the county, has organized a Deanery Laymen's Association getting in line with the other deaneries of Niagara Diocese and has requested the organization of parish associations. Consequently, last Wednesday evening, St. George's Laymen's Association was formed, a representative group of men meeting in the Club Room for the purpose. Archdeacon W. G. O. Thompson opened the meeting with the Creed and prayers, then outlined the objects of the Association, which are to help the parishes for all purposes looking to the progress of the Church and the religious life. A motion to organize was carried unanimously, and the following officers elected by ballot: President — Mr. A. E. Dawson; Vice-Pres. — Mr. Jack Armstrong; Sec. — Mr. Norman Smith. The Rector then asked Mr. Dawson to take the chair, which he did, and thanked the members for the election and mentioned the value to the Church which a loyal organization of men can be. It was decided that meetings be held on the second Wednesday of each month, and that no membership fee or dues should be levied. A list was passed for immediate expenses and found to contain a quite adequate amount. It was decided that a meeting should be held the following Wednesday, which would be the regular meeting night. The Rector dismissed the meeting with the benediction.

GEORGETOWN UNITED CHURCH

The theme of the morning worship at Georgetown Church on Sunday was "Living in Expectation". The lesson was read from Isaiah 9:2-7 and Luke 2:36-40. Basing his remarks on this latter passage Rev. John M. Smith emphasized the role that expectancy had played in the history of men both in a material and spiritual sense. He expressed the opinion that there was not enough expectancy within the church but rather a lack of faith — a lack of looking forward in confidence. Each Christmas, he said, brought anew the great challenge to men to live in expectation of the things that God would do through Jesus Christ, His Son. The fulfilment of Anna's expectation, he declared, opened up a whole new world of expectancy for all men. The choir under the direction of Miss Lynda Stewart sang the anthem "I do not ask, O Lord." The evening service was opened by the singing of a number of favorite hymns after which the lesson was read from St. Matt. 25:31-46. The subject of the evening message was "The Sin of Inactivity" and the text was chosen from Judges 6:23. The importance of being active in the work of the Kingdom of God was stressed. It was pointed out that to be indifferent and do nothing came under the condemnation of Christ. "The Other Wise Man" Henry Van Dyke's famous Christmas story is to be portrayed in pictures at the Young People's Meeting on Monday Night.
