Georgetown Wins 4-2 Against Oakville

Playing very effective hockey from the start of the game, the locals took Oakville at the Arena last Thursday night.

Oakville showing more form than in other games played hard but the Raiders were checking closely all night, and didn't allow too many shots on goal. Leger in goal for Oakville stopped a lot of shots and prevented the score from being higher than it was. The locals opened the scoring when Chappel banged in a rebound after Nash had been beaten on a hard shot. Two minutes later Del Beaumont scored the locals' second goal on a pass from Junior Beaumont and Kemshead. Strong defensive play by Patterson, Nash, kept Oakville from getting too close to the net. At the 5:00 minute mark of the second period Max Bradbury made it 3-0. On a long shot by Sutton from the blue line, Leger fanned one to give Oakville their first goal and spoiling Leger's shut-out. In the third period Ken Nash who had been outstanding all night completed a play set-up by Storey and Currie to give the locals their fourth goal. Another long shot from outside the blue line beat Leger to finish the scoring. Nash, Storey and Kemshead were exceptionally good for Georgetown.
