Halton Presbytery Holds Meeting

Halton Presbytery met in regular session at Waterdown United Church on Tuesday, December 7th. Rev. A. D. Penman of Lowville conducted the devotional period in the morning, basing his remarks on Psalm 85, verse 6, and stressing the need of a revival in our religious experiences. Dr. William England of Niagara Falls, President of Hamilton Conference, addressed the Presbytery on "How Are We Doing?" He stressed the need of recruits for the ministry; the need of an increase in the Missionary and Maintenance contributions; and the work of the laymen in the church. At the noon hour, Dr. Harvey Forster, Superintendent of All People's Missions in the Niagara Peninsula, spoke of the work among the non-Anglo Saxons in that district. This work had been started twenty-five years ago, and he spoke of the changes which had taken place in that time. He also
