CHRISTMAS SERVICES IN GEORGETOWN UNITED CHURCH

A Christmas White Gift service was held by the Sunday School in the Church auditorium on Sunday morning. The worship was conducted by the Superintendent, Mr. Alan Prouse, assisted by others of the school. The girls of Mrs. Wrigglesworth's class read the Christmas story from Luke 2:1-20 and sang the carol "Dear Little Stranger." Mr. Leslie Ellis, assistant superintendent led the school in prayer and Rev. J. M. Smith spoke to the boys and girls about Christmas celebration in other lands and the importance of making Christmas Christ-centred.

White Gifts of money, toys, clothing and food were received at the door and were offered for dedication with the offering by the boys of Messrs. Bob Wyatt's and Elmer McCubber's classes. These gifts are to be given to the Fred Victor Mission in Toronto for distribution to those whose Christmas promises to be dear in hopes that they might bring a little cheer.

Morning worship was conducted by the minister Rev. John M. Smith who read the lesson from Luke's Christmas Story and spoke on the subject "Emmanuel." As indicated in Matt. 1:23 he said that the word meant "God with us" and this fact is the very centre of Christmas. The message emphasized three main points: "God with us in human form," "God with us in human experience," "God with us in human redemption." Each Christmas, he said, brings afresh the challenge for man to rededicate himself to God through Christ.

The choir under the direction of Miss Lydia Stewart offered special music. Two anthems were sung — "Birthday of a King" by Neid-leigher, and "Gloria In Excelsis Deo" by Carolin Dimeon. Miss Ruth Evans sang the solo "He Shall Feed His Flock" from Handel's "The Messiah".

The evening worship was in the form of a Christmas Carol service and was approved by the choir under the direction of Miss Lydia Stewart, organist and choir leader.
