Comments on the Lesson

SUNDAY, JANUARY 9th
"Sources of Our Knowledge of Jesus"

It has been stated that more books have been written about Jesus — His life, death, resurrection and relationship to God and man — than about any other person before His time or since. Presumably most of them were written with the Bible, especially the New Testament, as a basis and source of material. Of the New Testament, the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John were the most detailed account of the life of our Lord in His earthly associations. The remaining books give an insight of the effect of Christ's life, death and resurrection, upon the first few generations of the Christian Church, and present His cause by statement, argument and explanation. The key verse of the New Testament could very well be that chosen as our memory verse for this week's lesson: "These are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through His name" — John 20:31. While we look upon the New Testament as a whole as our basic source of information concerning Christ, our actual knowledge of the historic Jesus must be gleaned from the Gospels. The gospels were written with the purpose of bringing Jesus and His message to the entire world. Within a lifetime the early church had expanded beyond the confines of Palestine and had established itself far and wide among the Gentiles. Already letters of advice and instruction regarding the Christian faith had been written by Paul and others but there was little information concerning the historic Jesus available to the new churches. other portions of our lesson emphasize the authenticity, purpose and subject of their writings being particular to mention their close connection to the historic Christ. The Application: In these days when so many books are available on the subject of the Christian faith, there is a definite need for us to read again and again the message of the Gospels — the source of our knowledge of Jesus. Other books may be supplementary but we ought not to substitute them for the scriptures. As we come to know the Jesus Christ of the New Testament we are guided into a way of life which opens up hitherto untapped spiritual power — the power which transforms individuals and churches. As we read we shall find that the knowledge gleaned is more than general information. "It is of that deeper kind which purges the soul, inspires the higher nature, deepens the thought, fills the mind with a sense of the majesty and mystery of life, its moral responsibilities and its spiritual potentialities."
