**George Allen Was Veteran of Northwest Rebellion**

Following an illness of several months George Allen passed away in Peel Memorial Hospital on Saturday, January 15. Mr. Allen was born in England eighty five years ago, coming to Canada some twenty years later. He farmed in the Guelph district, moving afterwards to Markham. About twelve months ago he came to live with his son Clayton, in Glen Williams.

He took part in the North West Rebellion and was numbered among Markham's oldest veterans. His wife predeceased him by many years. Mr. Allen is survived by one son, Clayton, two granddaughters, one great grandson and one sister, in the Western States.

The funeral was held on Tuesday from the R. H. Glendenning Funeral Home, the Rev. F. Herman conducted the service and interment took place in the Anglican Cemetery. The pall bearers were fellow veterans.

**Take Notice That...**

1. The Council of the Corporation of the Town of Georgetown intend to extend the sanitary sewers to service the lands hereinafter described as a local improvement, and intends to especially assess a part of the costs upon the land abutting directly on the work. Particulars of the land are as follows: Durham Street from Union Street to Elgin Street; Henry Street from Elgin Street to Sarah Street; Sarah Street from Henry Street to King Street; Elgin Street from Henry Street to King Street.

2. The estimated cost of the work is \$5000.20, of which \$2000.20 is to be paid by the Corporation. The estimate per foot frontage is \$1.00. The special assessment is to be paid in twenty annual instalments.

3. A petition to the said Council will not avail to prevent its construction, but a petition against the work or the manner in which it has been undertaken may be made pursuant to Section 10 of the Local Improvement Act, to the Ontario Municipal Board, by a majority of the owners representing at least one half of the value of the lots which are to be specially assessed therefor.

4. A by-law for undertaking the work will be considered by the Council at a meeting thereof to be held on the 7th day of March, 1949, or at a regular or a special meeting thereof to be held thereafter.
