IT SEEMS TO ME!

The water rates are up and apparently we are due for considerable argument on the water situation. There are still remnants of the 'water shortage' notices of last summer to be seen on various Hydro poles. The sewers are coming into use, new houses are being built and plumbing is being improved. All this calls for more water and plenty of it, if the town is to continue to grow in homes and industry. It seems to me that sooner or later we must settle down to the idea of increasing our water sources. It might cost us more but I sure would like to use a hose for the extra money.

Many of us have had a lot to say on the old GRC's efforts in the last few years. That group has resigned and a new Recreational Council is to be organized on a community basis.
