Hello, Homemakers! When such occasions as Valentine's Day fall on a weekday you have to consider how much time there'll be to prepare a lunch for a party after school or office hours. We suggest a buffet supper as the easiest, simplest and most informal way to entertain upon such occasions, especially when the house is small. Besides, everybody likes helping themselves from a buffet table and then wandering around until they find a place at a bridge table with a partner of their own choosing.

The food too is simple — just one hot dish, preferably something in a casserole that's easy to serve, or you may have a platter of cold cuts and then have scalloped or creamed potatoes as the hot dish. Include a bowl of crisp salad, a tray of hot rolls or biscuits, tartar and coffee for a menu that can be prepared well in advance and one which takes little time to clean up afterwards.

To keep the heart-shape theme you may make red raspberry ice cream or cake decorated with red arrows or heart-shaped cookies to serve as dessert.

For the casserole dish, it may be creamed chicken, Spanish rice with tomatoes, Eggs Thermidor or Supper Meat Pie. Choose the dish you know you can prepare best.

Cold cuts can be made up during the weekend. Jellyed tongue or chopped veal with tomatoes, or baked salmon loaf.

Make the salad greens of finely shredded cabbage, grated carrot, chopped nuts and drained crushed pineapple tossed together in a bowl and place a dish of dressing and bottle of French dressing on the table.

Arrange the food on one long table with stacked plates, rows of silver and napkins in convenient order so that guests can serve themselves without confusion. Then if you have card tables or sections of your nest of tables set around the room all they have to do is meander over and sit down. Coffee can be served from the kitchen or the cups and saucers arranged at one end of the buffet table. It is a matter of convenience and service.

SPANISH RICE WITH TOMATOES

1 cup rice
4 tablespoons chopped onion
2 cups canned tomatoes
1 teaspoon salt
Grated (sharp) cheese
3 tablespoons margarine
4 tablespoons green pepper or chopped celery
1 cup water
1/2 cup large peanuts
Wash rice thoroughly. Melt margarine in pan; add onion and celery; cook until tender. Add remaining ingredients, except cheese, cover and simmer about 40 minutes on "low" electric element. Serve with grated cheese. Serves 8.

EGGS THERMIDOR

Hard cooked eggs, sliced bread
Thermidor sauce
Bring a small amount of water and 1 tablespoon salt to a boil. Add eggs (1 per person) and cover. Cook on covered electric element on "off" position 12 minutes. Cool quickly. Slice bread about 1 inch thick, as many slices as eggs. Using a doughnut cutter, press into rings. Arrange these on a broad, shallow pan. Into each ring, nest a peeled egg, large end down. Pour thermidor sauce over all. Heat in electric oven at 350 degrees for 15 minutes.

Thermidor Sauce

2 small onions (chopped), 2 green peppers (or 1 cup celery, chopped), 1/2 cup margarine or butter, 1 cup chili sauce, 1 cup catsup and 1 pint cream. Sauté onion and celery in fat, add remaining ingredients. Cook 5 minutes.

SUPPER MEAT PIE

4 tablespoons chopped onion
1 pound ground beef
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon bacon dripping
1 can tomato soup
1/2 teaspoon pepper
Pastry dough.

Cook onion in butter until soft. Add beef and cook until brown. Blend in soup, add salt and pepper, mix well. Line a 9-inch pie plate with pastry, moistening edges with cold water. Fill with meat mixture, cover with top crust, press crust together in fluted design. Bake in moderate hot electric oven of 375 degrees for 1 hour — along with scalloped potatoes. Serves about 8.

VALENTINE CAKE

1 cup sifted cake flour
3 eggs
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 cup hot strong coffee
1 cup sugar
3 tablespoons shortening
Combine sifted flour with baking powder and salt and sift three times. Combine beaten eggs, sugar and beat until light and fluffy. Add

shortening to hot coffee. When melted, stir mixture into beaten eggs and sugar. Fold in flour gradually. Bake in shallow greased pan for 45 minutes in preheated electric oven at 350 degrees. Invert on cake cooler and when cool remove from pan and decorate with frosting and heart shaped candies.

SUNDAY SNOW REMOVAL CLEARS MAIN STREET

The inconvenience of snow banks in the Main Street district, which hampered shoppers in finding parking space on Saturday was overcome on Sunday when snow plows and a fleet of trucks restored the street to normal. It was the first time this winter that the snow had been heavy enough to necessitate such action.

This procedure of snow removal by machinery rather than hand labour was adopted last year by Deputy Reeve Jim Goodlet who was Roads Chairman of the 1948 council and proved so successful that it is being continued. Motorists and pedestrians alike benefit from the service and Georgetown can boast of one of the best cleared business districts in Ontario because of it.


