OTTAWA RESIDENT 40 YEARS J. J. STEPHENS BURIED HERE

Rev. John M. Smith officiated at a committal service in Greenwood Cemetery on Monday morning for John Joseph Chit Stephens who died in Ottawa Civic Hospital on Thursday, February 10th, after a prolonged illness.

Mr. Stephens who was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Stephens, was born in England, 75 years ago, and was a baby of six months when his parents emigrated to Canada.
