"Faith in Confusion" was the sermon title at the Georgetown United Church on Sunday, March 13. Basing his remarks on the scripture lesson Hebrews 11: 1-10 and the text 1 John 5: 4, Mr. Smith spoke of the evident individual, national, and international confusion which appears by our generation and of the tendency toward resignation to a spirit of nihilism and the attitude of "What's the use?" A look at the advance of civilization, he said, reveals the important role played by faith in man's life of development and achievement — "without faith man would still be in the barbarian stage." The way out of confusion must begin and end with faith in someone or something, and it is the Christian belief that the way out of individual and world confusion depends upon man's faith in God, in Christ, and His plan for mankind. This faith is for Christians a source of knowledge and calls forth their absolute belief, trust and obedience and leads them out to a greater faith in themselves, their fellowmen and the universe.
