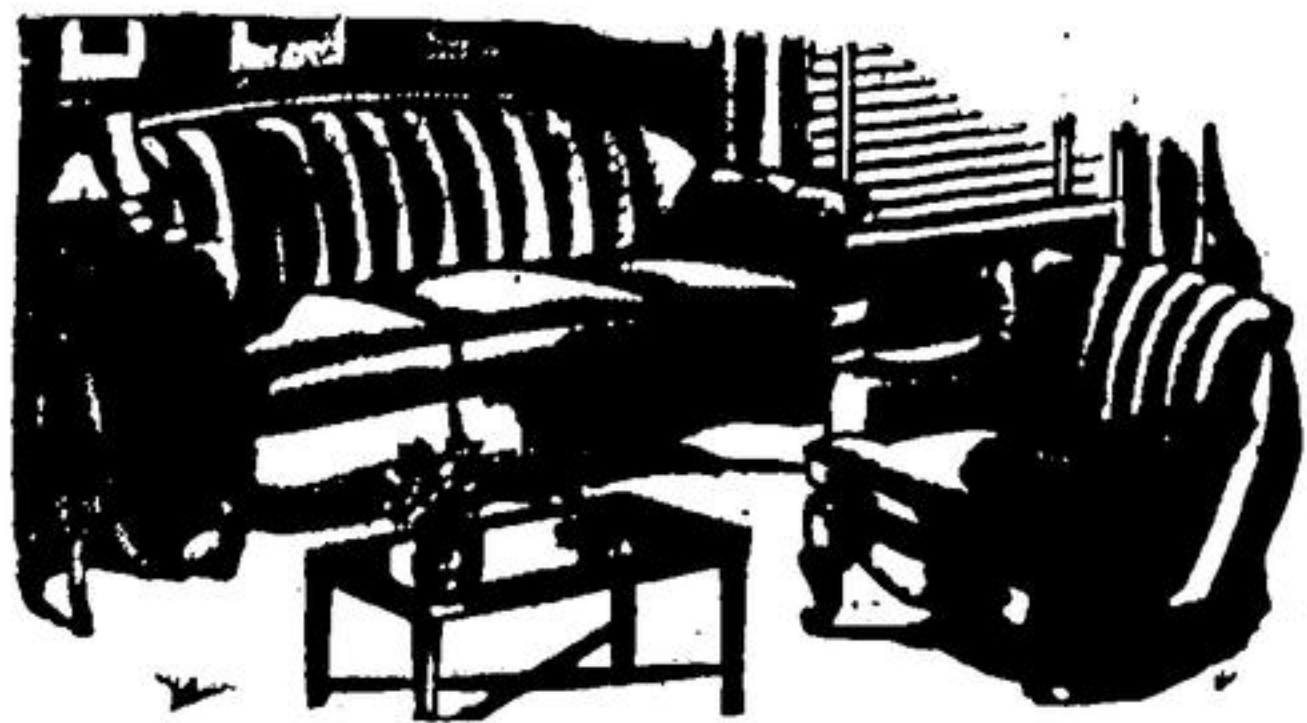

THURSDAY, MARCH 24th

7.00 a.m. Alarm went off.
