At 19:38 of the second period, Chappel, who was flying all night, took a pass from Nick Ferri and beat Schmidt to put Georgetown one goal up. The game was not over yet but the wild cheering mob left the impression that it was their, Kipfer and Melanson were penalized in the second.

As the teams came out for the third stanza it was still very doubtful as to the outcome. Storey, playing with an eye injury, shot one from well out which was pushed over the line by Jr. Beaumont, at 6:05. Most of the fans thought the game was in the bag, but Yost, playing with all his strength and ability, let a hard one go from centre ice. Lever fanned easily on this shot. With only a one goal deficit the Milverton team fought desperately and Yost again scored unassisted to tie the game at the 10:10 mark. Bowman, Bundscho, and Kipfer received penalties in the third.

Going into overtime it was anybody's ball game. The teams knew it and so did the fans. Chuck Currie on a pass from Storey at 3:20 drew Schmidt out and back handed the winning goal into the net. It was Currie from Storey who scored the winning goal against Bridgeport in overtime for the Group Championship and again the same two kept Georgetown in the running. Before the overtime period was up, Chappel added an insurance counter on a pass from Ferri and Martin. One penalty in the overtime period, to Kipfer.
