

Sailors Torpedoed, Raiders Win 9-3

Georgetown Wins Two Games Straight to Advance to Finals with Sundridge — Many Injuries Against Rugged Port Dover Team.

A swash-buckling, injury-ridden hockey game played here last Wednesday night between the Raiders and Port Dover Sailors saw the home team again torpedo the Sailors by a 9-3 score.

There was very little doubt in the minds of the fans as to which was the better team. The first and second periods were very poor hockey and only in the third did the game become exciting. The Raiders levelled their heavy artillery on young Jack Lawrence. In goal for the Sailors and although nine went by him he alone kept it from being 29. To say he was sensational is putting it mildly. Time after time he brought the bid Georgetown fans to their feet applauding the magnificent display of goal-tending he was rendering. He kicked, caught, juggled and deflected shot after shot that was labelled. In the third period at one time the Raiders were ganging and had to take eight shots before they finally beat him. Before Lawrence took charge of the performance the game was filled with injuries — Kenny Nash received a back injury; Jr. Beaumont took a severe check and lost some teeth; Jack Kemshead was injured behind the ear and three stitches were required; Rene Martin left the game with a badly wrenched knee after a collision with Steele, who was

also badly shaken up. Kelly then left the ice for stitches and Chub Mummery left the ice with a nasty gash in his face.

The Sailors were no match for the fast-moving Raiders on a big ice surface or small. They were a much slower team and not as effective around the net as the Raiders, Kelly and Mummery. Greenslade and Spittal along with Lawrence were the best for Port Dover while Ferri, Storey, Chappel and Currie were tops for the locals.

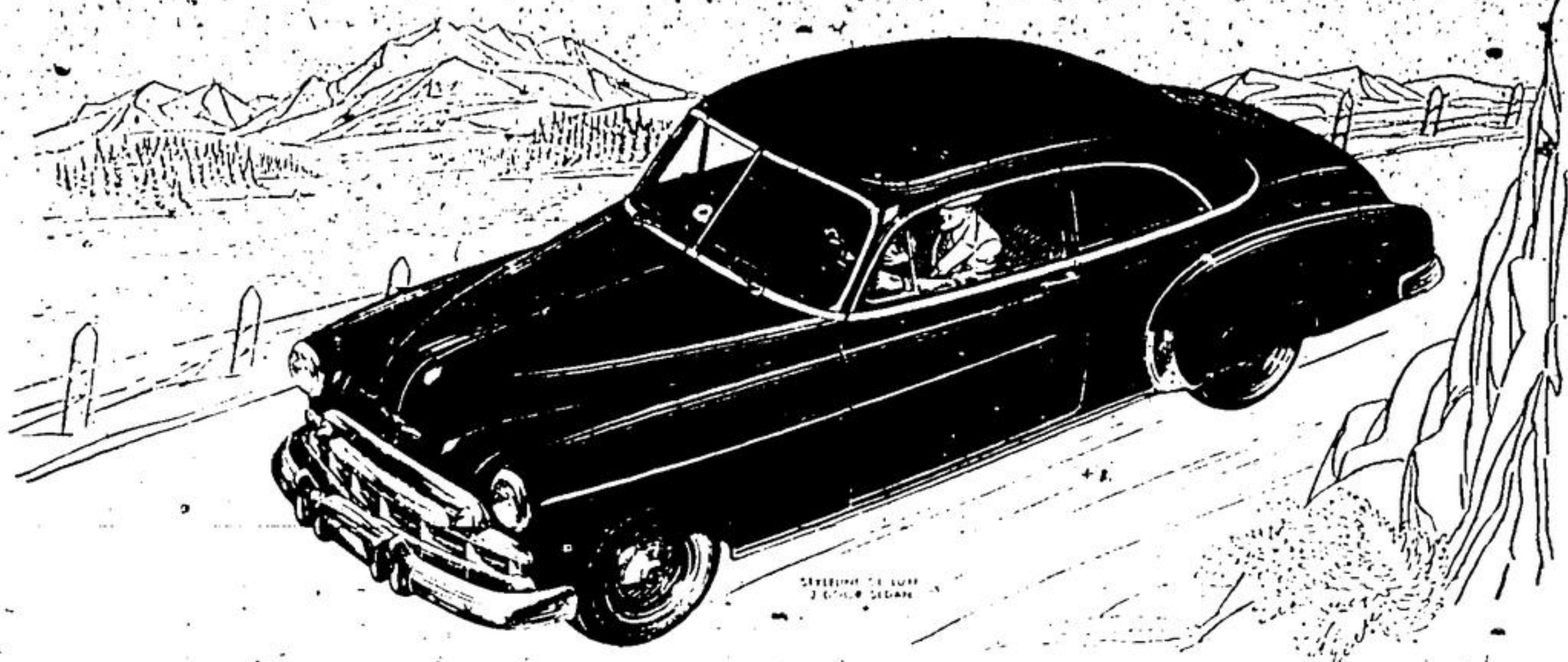

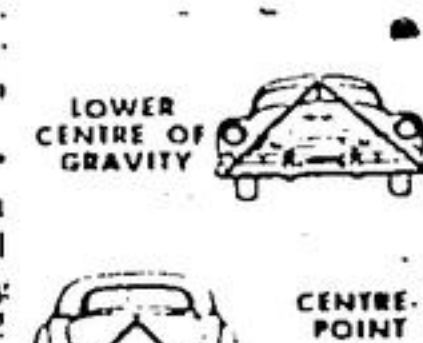

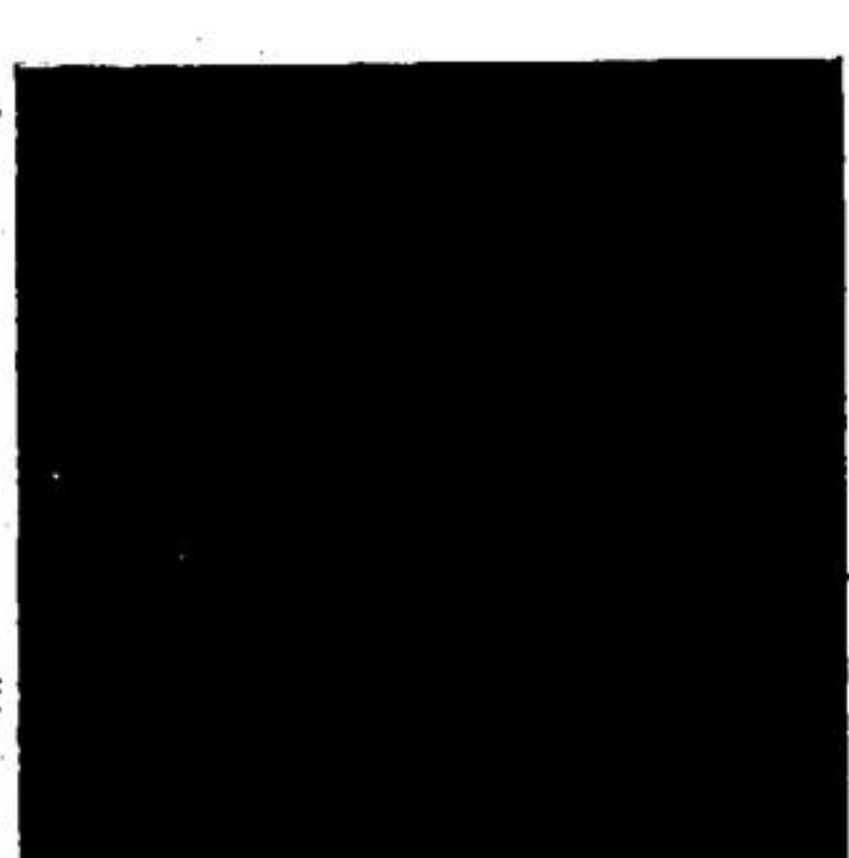
