## Storey Upsets Bucko and his Beavers

Four Goal Spurge in Third Win  
Second Game for Raiders —  
Christie Scores Three for Visitors

Two thousand cheering, screaming, thrilled hockey fans watched as Kent Storey, brilliant centre star of the Raiders, look over the whole show in the third period of Thursday night's game here and scored four goals in a row. Three of these goals were scored in less than a minute and a half. Bucko and his crew were dazed by the dazzling display Storey put on. Raiders won 9-4.

The first period was a fast one with Georgetown missing two sure chances. Storey and Currie tested Schade from close in early in the period but failed to click and part way through the period Ferri failed to hit one at the open corner. Sundridge were waiting for the breaks as the Raiders poured in. Russell for the Beavers opened the scoring at 8:16 of the first after he snapped off his own rebound off Lever. The Raiders, although a goal down, carried the play and should have had a couple. It only took Dolly Beaumont 1:32 of the second period to find the Sundridge net and he made no mistake. This tied the score 1-1. Nash broke the tie with a twenty footer that had Schade fooled all the way. The pace was very fast and both teams were playing fine hockey. Christie, the go-getter for the Beavers, scored two in a row to put his team one up but with only ten seconds remaining in the period Max Bradbury scored from in front of the net to tie the game. As the teams returned to the ice for the start of the third the large crowd never anticipated such a dazzling display as Storey put on in the first few minutes. After scoring four in a row he hit the goal post on his fifth try. Hats, programs and what have you descended to the ice as his team mates mobbed him. At the other end the Sundridge team were stunned by the onslaught. To put the game on ice, Ferri and Max Bradbury added tallies while Christie added one for the Beavers. The game was fast, fairly clean, with the Raiders having a definite edge. While Storey and Patterson were really outstanding, so were the rest of the Raiders. Christie scored three of their goals and was an outstanding figure.
