> Brown Rolls: Dissolve I pkg. yeast granules in ½ cup lukewarm water. Into 1 cup scalded, cool milk, '2 cup warm water, stir 4 cup molasses and 12 tbsp. salt; then add yeast and mix in sufficient flour (4 cups graham flour) to make a soft dough. Add 2 tbsps. melted shortening and beat well. Mix in another 1; cur flour to make a slack dough but not sticky. Turn out on floured board and knead 30 times. Place in large greased bowl, cover with tea towel and let rise until double in bulk. Then punch down and snip off pieces with seissors, roll and place in greased muffin pans. Let rise again '2 size. Then bake immediately in hot electric oven of 425 degrees for 15 minutes.

Easter Nest Dessert: Dissolve a package of cherry jell-o and pour into individual round moulds or in a round glass dish. Chill until firm in the electric refrigerator. Then turn individual moulds on serving plates, or use doughnut cutter and egg lifter to transfer circles of jelly to flat plates. Fill the centres with balls of cheese rolled in cocoanut and, green maraschino cherries.

Oatmeat Cookles: Mix together 1/2 cup shortening, I cup brown sugar, I tsp. salt, I 'cup chopped raisins, 1 tsp. cinnamon, 1 tsp. soda dissolved in 1 tosp. hot water, 2 cups coarse ontmeal and 1% cups partry flour. Drop batter from shoon into greased baking sheet. Bake in electric oven at 400 degrees for 20
