"RISE OF GRASS" BASIC TO SURVIVAL

We were interested in an article which was brought to our attention in a recent copy of the Saturday Evening Post. The article in question by D. T. Painter, Supervisor of the Agricultural Extension Service in Virginia makes a few statements which we feel are worthy of repetition.

"Much needed today is a more efficient utilization of grassland products. Therefore, the greatest agricultural advancement during the next generation will be known as the 'Rise of Grass,' with a decided trend toward more and better grasses and legumes, and fewer row crops. This will bring about better land use on areas now devoted to soil-depleting crops. Grasses and forests are the logical crops to conserve soil, improve fertility and alleviate floods and droughts. We are beginning to realize the possibilities of an efficient grassland system."
