

Doing Something About the Weather



Far out in the stormy North Atlantic Ocean seamen (1) aboard the Canadian weather ship H.M.C.S. St. Stephen, prepare to release a radio-equipped balloon which will radio back reports on weather conditions in the upper atmosphere. The St. Stephen (2) is one of 13 weather ships, supplied by eight countries and financed by 10, which make up a network arranged by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), a specialized agency of the United Nations. The ICAO weather ships are on constant duty, ready to radio passing aircraft late weather information, and to participate in search and rescue operations. A specialist (3) maps weather data coming from a weather balloon and prepares it for broadcast to passing planes and shore-stations.

LOCAL HOLSTEINS AT NATIONAL SALE

International Livestock Exporters, Oakville, bought six head at the National Holstein Sale held May 23 at Oakville. These were purchased for Prince Tortonia, Rome, Italy, who was represented at the sale by Dr. della Eavera, farm manager for Prince Tortonia who operates one of Italy's largest dairy farms near Rome. Dent, Woodstock, Ont., and Handy Shore, Ganworth Ont., at \$1000, \$975 and \$700 respectively. The Innes heifer was the highest priced bred heifer of the sale.

The crowd estimated at well over 1000 was on hand for the sale and buyers were present from all parts of the United States and Canada.
