SLIGO HILL CURVE TO BE STRAIGHTENED

Scene of many fatal accidents in past years, the curving roadway at Sligo Hill on No. 10 Highway, five miles south of Caledon, is to be straightened, The Ontario Govern ment of Highways has awarded a contract to the Dover Construction Company of Brampton and work is expected to start immediately. The job also provides for a 1500-foot diversion for the small branch of the Credit River which flows under the highway at this point, building a new bridge, and decreasing the
