FORMER GLEN MAN WAS NOTED PIPER

Funeral services were held in Toronto last week for William Bain, a former resident of Glen Williams, who died at his home in Toronto on May 29th after a lengthy illness. Mr. Bain was born in Scotland 66 years ago and came to Canada in 1912. He worked for a short time on the farm of Bert Taylor at Cheltenham, then moved to the Glen where he was employed with the Beaumont Knitting Mills. He served overseas in the first war with the 134th Battalion, and after returning home moved to Brampton where he managed a store. Later he moved to Toronto where he had been employed with the T. Eaton Co.

Before coming to Canada, Mr. Bain had served with the British army in Egypt, India and Africa. While serving in India with the Argyll and Sutherland he learned to play the pipes, and in 1928 he joined the Irish Regiment and held the rank of Pipe-Major until the end of World War II. A familiar figure in his kilts, he was an authority on bagpipes and trained two pipe bands for the Irish Regiment, the Malvern Colliery Pipe Band and a number of girl pipers.

He is survived by his wife, Mary Ann Muckart, a sister of George Muckart of town, a son Frank Bain, coach of the Weston lacrosse club and a daughter, Mrs. W. Halligan of Toronto.

Ray Kercher Buys Tottenham Grocery

Mr. and Mrs. Ray Kercher are leaving tomorrow for Tottenham where they will make their home. Mr. Kercher has purchased the business of Thornton's Grocery in that town, which includes a store and living quarters. A veteran of the paper industry, he retired earlier this year from his position as superintendent of the Provincial Paper Mill, where he had been employed for the past ten years. It will be the second time Mr. Kercher has left town. He originally managed the Provincial mill here, leaving to manage the Alliance mill when it was first opened here by Mr. L. E. Fleck, and later going to Valleyfield, Quebec, where for several years he was manager of Valleyfield Coated Paper Co.
